Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Frank Ramirez writes, "One of the consistent elements in the ancient mythologies is conflict in the heavens. In the Greek pantheon, Gaia and Kronos are supplanted by the Titans, who in turn are overthrown by the Olympian gods that we are familiar with through the The Iliad, The Odyssey, and other ancient stories. There is conflict between the gods, grudges that are nursed, and revenge that wreaks havoc in the heavens that like ripples from a stone thrown in a pond create upheaval on earth.

"Though the Judeans who shared the Hebrew scriptures believed in the One God, they accepted the fact that there are echoes of this ancient conflict to demonstrate that God has no equals, no peers, and no competition. In the first chapter of Genesis, the Spirit of God hovers over the deeps and dispatches the gods of chaos, Tohu and Bohu, translated formless and void. In both Daniel 12 and Revelation 12 it is the archangel Michael who dispatches Lucifer from heaven, not God, not because God is unable, but there the two do not appear in the same picture so that no one can get the false idea that God has a rival."

The false gods of our day don't go by names like "Zeus", or "Thor", or "Tiamat". They are more subtle. They are ideas that warp our minds and draw us away from total trust in God our maker. Today's gods try to convince us that our purpose in this world is to get ahead of all other people, to dominate and control.

Christ could have dominated the world. He could have forced obedience from all people. But he did not. He showed a better way to live, through self-sacrifice and mercy. His greatness came from practicing generosity, seeking the best for others, and being at peace with one and all.

Pastor's Report: Pastor shared his report. He will be on vacation for the next three weeks. Pastor Rushton and

his wife Jeanine will be here during this absence.

Secretary's Report: June's minutes were read and approved.

Financial Secretary's Report: The Financial Reports from June and July were read and approved.

June Totals: Current: \$ 7,983 Benevolence: \$ 125 Memorial (Cem): \$1,355 Thrivent: \$75

July Totals: Current: \$ 3,396.85 Benevolence: \$ 0 Memorial: \$ 0

Treasurer's Report: The Treasurer's Reports from April and May were read and approved.

The Contributions to the General Fund for June was \$ 9,538.00.

Expenses for the month were \$5,486.71. The larger expenses this month included church insurance, salaries whealth and pension and mileage, elevator check, phone internet, elec

insurance, salaries w/health and pension and mileage, elevator check, phone/internet, electric.

The Contributions to the General Fund for July was \$ 3,396.85.

Expenses for the month were \$ 9,623.76. The larger expenses this month included salaries, 3 AC Units repaired, elevator inspection, church insurance, Mowing/Groundskeeping, Phone/internet, electric. It was noted that Insurance has almost doubled since 2020, it was \$538 per month, and now 2025 it's \$1058 per month. A motion was made to meet with the company, seconded and approved. A gift card will be given to Will for playing piano last month.

Deacon's Report: Meghan has September and is looking for Communion Help first Sunday.

Trustees Report: Three AC units and fan switch was not working last month. Monday Pete got help to get it fixed by Carol Mestad's funeral on Wednesday. Pete is looking for a painting company to patch up under the balcony in the sanctuary. Pete cut and cleaned some wind damaged pines around church. Pete met with Casey about asbestos removal in parsonage and classrooms at East. Annual elevator check, Pete put his name down as a contact person.

Parsonage Report: Mel and Pete worked cleaning up fallen trees at parsonage after storm. Had a logger, Josh, stop by to look at other possibly damaged trees, OK for now, so leave them.
